## Isaiah 64:1-5 NLT

Oh, that you would burst from the heavens and come down! How the mountains would quake in your PRESENCE! As fire causes wood to burn and water to boil, your coming would make the nations tremble. Then your enemies would learn the reason for your fame! When you came down long ago, you did awesome deeds beyond our highest expectations. And oh, how the mountains quaked! [4] For since the world began, no ear has heard and no eye has seen a God like you, who works for those who WAIT for him! [5] You welcome those who gladly do good, who follow godly ways.

The idea of WAITING sounds like a period of doing nothing. Although it implies inactivity, it doesn't mean that we are entirely unfocused. For example, a lion can wait patiently and stealthily as it hunts its prey. It is a period of great focus and attention. Likewise, as we wait upon the Lord for Him to breakthrough the heavens - we can focus our attention, desires and hunger on Him with great expectation in our hearts.

Secondly, that focus will require us to surrender other things that could perhaps be a distraction to our main focus on His presence, power and manifestation. When we focus on the Lord in praise, worship and prayer - it's best to turn off all devices, set aside time without any interruptions or distractions from social media or work. Remember that when we come to His altar daily, we should always bring a sacrifice ... of our time, talents and treasure.

May the Lord show us His ways of living - He seeks worshippers who worship Him in spirit and in truth. We should live in the overflow of His spirit ready to share the gospel with anyone. Remember to listen and give people an experience of the kingdom of heaven.

Action: Let's wait in Expectation for the Lord to begin to move. Ask Him to REVIVE our nation (Psalm 2 and Psalm 85:1-6). Surrender our lives to Him and clear a pathway for revival - make those lifestyle changes and come back to His way of living.
